Report for 2015

Annual Report

The number of our member clubs increased in 2015 and went up to 183 which was an increase of 2 over the 2014 figure. The number of member clubs has been decreasing year on year and hopefully this small increase is an indication that our numbers will now level off or even increase. We had six clubs that did not rejoin in 2015 which was balanced by six new clubs joining. Two other clubs that had been out of membership for a couple of years rejoined. Over half of our clubs have 30 members or fewer while 31 clubs have 17 or fewer members. Of the six clubs that did not rejoin one had 22 members, another had 17 members and two had 15 members.

At the 2015 AGM it was pointed out that it was getting harder for clubs to get new members to keep them above the minimum 15 that is required to take part in competitions and as a result a proposal is being put forward at the 2016 AGM to reduce that minimum number to 12 and to reduce the time that a club requires to have been in existence from 2 years to 1 year.

AGM

The 2016 annual general meeting is scheduled for Sunday 6th March at the King Robert Hotel, Bannockburn. Clubs that are unable to attend the AGM can submit proxy voting forms by email as well as by post and clubs that are able to accept emails are requested to include their email address on the membership renewal form.

AGM Resolutions on Clubs Taking Part in Competitions

The Bye-laws direct that in order to take part in SANACC competitions a club must have a minimum of 15 members paying an annual subscription and that the club must have been in existence for at least two years. In 2015 we had 11 clubs with 15 members; 11 clubs with 16 members; 9 clubs with 17 members and 15 clubs with 18 members. We are in a position where just over 25% of our clubs are close to being unable to enter the competitions due to low membership numbers. It is the view of the SANACC Committee that there is now a need to reduce the minimum number from 15 to 12 and that by reducing the qualifying period of being in existence from 2 years to 1 year it could encourage the formation of new clubs.

The Special Resolutions being put forward are to alter the Bye-laws to that effect.

Subscriptions

The 2016 annual subscription has not been increased and will remain at £35. The cost of the annual subscription has not been increased since 2006.

Finance

SANACC remains in a sound financial position with sufficient reserves to ensure its survival in the event of unexpected changes to income or costs.

Sponsorship and Fundraising

The support that was received from all of our sponsors, those that attended the fundraisers or bought raffle tickets meant that the cost of representing Scotland in the international teams was kept at an affordable level whilst also rewarding success in the competitions. The SANACC Committees, team members and competitors are grateful to all of the sponsors and individuals who supported them.

Sponsorship/Fundraising – Loch Teams

Fishers, the Lake of Menteith, Albert Bartlett and 7Plus7 Construction were the main sponsors of the International loch teams in 2015. Fishers have confirmed that they will sponsor the teams again in 2016 which will be their 5th year of sponsorship. This was the Lake of Menteith's seventh year of sponsorship and the fifth for 7Plus7 Construction.. BVG Airflo and Flyfish Europe have supported the teams for numerous years and provided their products again in 2015. The teams were also sponsored in 2015 by C.E.F., Newey & Eyre, Principal & Prosper, Bell Donaldson Steele, Jewson and Jim Youngman Carpets.

There were five fundraisers held between February and April. They started on 7th February with the SANACC International Loch Teams Fundraiser Cup at Markle followed a week later by the Wullie Simpson run fundraiser at Parkview. In March we had the Albert Bartlett Fundraiser at New Haylie followed by one at Black Loch. The final fundraiser was at Achagour in April. Sponsorship of the fundraisers was provided by Fishers, Albert Bartlett and Flybox. Prizes were provided by Fishers, Flybox, ND Barrett Electrical, James Haig & Sons, Daiwa, FAFA-Linlithgow Loch, Celtic Property Poland, Black Loch, Parkview Fishery, Carron Valley Fishery, Lake of Menteith, Glencorse Reservoir, Watt & Sons Tackle and many other individuals.

The Glasgow Angling Centre provided two wooden fly boxes which the two loch teams filled with 140 flies and raffled at the National heats and semis. The box filled by the Spring team was won by Ian Muir of Grizzle Cats. The box filled by the Autumn team was won by Ken Kennedy of Orkney TFA.

Funds were also raised through the sale of 'Loch Cards'.

Sponsorship/Fundraising – River Team

The Rivers team were sponsored by RGMC Properties Ltd, Fly-Fishing World and Points North (International) Ltd with additional funds being raised through 'River cards'.

Sponsorship – Scottish National Championship

The Championship was sponsored for the third year by Ridgeline UK who provided Ridgeline Igloo Tops to the winners of all six semi-finals along with a Monsoon Smock Coat to the National Champion, a Ridgeline Torrent Jacket to the runner-up a Pintail Smock Jacket to the third and a Ridgeline Grizzly Jacket to the captor of the heaviest fish in the final. Ridgeline UK have confirmed that they will support the National again in 2016.

The fly measures that were used at the heats and the semi finals were provided by Glencorse RSV and the fly measures that were used in the final and will also be used throughout 2016 were provided by 7Plus7 Construction.

Sponsorship – Scottish Club Championship

The Scottish Club Championship was sponsored by Angling Active and Keir Hardie Joinery. Angling Active provided tackle vouchers for the winning clubs in the final while Keir Hardie Joinery provided the fly measures that were issued to the competitors. This was the 12th and last year of sponsorship of the competition by Angling Active and the Scottish Club Championship has been very fortunate to have had such a lengthy connection with them. The Scottish Clubs Committee wish to thank Martin Grantham and Angling Active for their support over the last twelve years and wish them every success for the future.

Sponsorship – Champion of Champions

Snowbee once again sponsored the Champion of Champions. They provided the winner with a Snowbee Geo rod, the runner-up with a reel and the third placed with a fly line. The fly measures were provided by Keir Hardie Joinery.

Competition – Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship

The number of anglers who fished in the 2015 National was down considerably on the previous year. In 2014 there were 382 competitors but this year that was down to 361. The strength of the wind was a feature throughout the season and we were very fortunate that all stages of the competition were able to go ahead as planned once again. The 2015 National Champion is Stuart Marklow (photo on front page) of Loanhead & District. Peter Auchterlonie of Menteith Ospreys was second with the same number of fish and third was John Buchanan of Newton Mearns FF with just one fish less. Only one competitor was disqualified during the competition..

Competition – Scottish National River Championship

The heats and final of the River Championship were held on the Pitlochry AC stretch of the River Tummel and we are grateful to the Pitlochry AC members for their continued support. The number of competitors was up slightly at 39 compared to 2014 when there were 36 competitors. The 2015 National River Champion is Simon Cocker of D & B FF.

Scottish Club Championship

The number of teams competing in the Scottish Club Championship was 165 which was one up on 2014. The collections taken at the Saturday heats for the Yorkhill Sick Children's Hospital along with the collections and raffles at the semi-finals and finals raised a total of £1,671.50. The 2015 Champions are Neilston FF "B". Menteith Ospreys were second and Change FF AC "A" were third.

Champion of Champions

Competitors in the Champion of Champions qualify from the Saturday night heats of the Scottish Club Championship with the top five individuals each Saturday night going through to the Champion of Champions final. Spaces not taken up by the top five qualifiers are allocated on a count back at each heat. The 2015 Champion of Champions is Stewart Barclay of Granite City AC. Derek Hissett, also of Granite City AC was second and Ronnie Gilbert of Menteith Ospreys was third.

Spring International – Rutland Water

Our loch teams had a superb 2015. In the Spring International at Rutland Water they took the gold medal with 5 fish more than England. Top three rods for Scotland were Derek Purves of Bank of Scotland East with 12 fish, Alan Gilbert of SPRA West with 11 fish and Andy Dunn of Change FF with 10 fish. Derek Purves took the Brown Bowl as the top individual.

Autumn International - Lake of Menteith

Gold remained the colour in the Autumn International at the Lake of Menteith where we won with the heaviest weight although we had one trout less than England. Our top three rods were Allan Smith of Kinross AC with 13 fish, Campbell Morgan of Strathleven FF with 12 fish and Stuart McLean of East Kilbride AC with 10 fish.

River International - River Liffey, Ireland

At the International on the River Liffey, Ireland we picked up the wooden spoon when we were fourth.

Competition Results

123rd Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship (Sponsored by Ridgeline UK, Glencorse Reservoir and 7Plus7 Construction)

The 2015 Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Champion is Stuart Marklow of Loanhead & District AC. Stuart had 12 fish for 26lbs 3.8ozs and just pipped the 2010 National Champion and 2011 Champion of Champions winner, Peter Auchterlonie of Menteith Ospreys, who also had 12 fish but with a weight of 25lbs 9.6ozs. Close behind in third was the 2013 Champion of Champions winner John Buchanan of Newton Mearns FF who had 11 fish for 23lbs 1.6ozs.

A forecast suggesting that winds of 28mph gusting to 40mph could hit the Lake of Menteith in the morning of the National final followed by constant torrential rain throughout the afternoon gave cause for concern that the final would have to be cancelled. The wind did come from the southeast as forecast but fortunately it never reached the forecast strength and the competition went ahead as scheduled. The boats set off in light rain and although it rained for most of the day it was not as heavy as expected. It was however cold for most of the day. About mid afternoon the wind moved round to the southwest and as it dropped to a light breeze the clouds lifted, the temperature rose and the competitors started catching in earnest. It wasn't to last for long as the wind soon picked up again and the rain came back.

No final is ever easy to win but with the winners of six of the last eight Nationals (Ronnie Gilbert - 2014 and 2008; Kevin McCabe - 2013; Ronnie Glass - 2011; Peter Auchterlonie - 2010 and Alex McEwan - 2007) and eleven of the 2015 International teams lining up it looked like 2015 would be particularly hard. Boats headed for all parts of the Lake at the off and within the first couple of hours there were boats criss crossing the water as the competitors searched for fish. The trout were not for giving themselves up and many anglers struggled.



The competition was fished on a partial catch and release basis with the first three trout being retained and 2lb awarded for each fish caught and returned. Heavy fish were capped at 4lb and there were several 4lb plus fish and two over 5lb. The heaviest fish brought to the scales weighed 5lbs 13.8ozs and was caught by Kinross AC angler Ally Middlemas.

As the competitors weighed-in there were plenty

of anxious faces. The top 18 were guaranteed a place in the 2016 International teams and it was tight. Two competitors weighed-in 12 trout. There was one bag of 11 and one of 10. Five competitors had 9 fish; two had 8 fish; thirteen had 7 fish; eleven had 6 fish and seven had 5 fish. Team manager, Gus Shepherd, had 7 fish for 14lbs 15ozs which put him in 17th place but he gave up his place as an angler in the teams and the long journey from Orkney proved worthwhile for Andrew Morgan of Merkister FF who had 7 fish for 14lbs 13.4ozs and finished in 19th position and secured the last guaranteed team spot. Not only had Ally Middlemass caught a fish over 5lbs he had also taken two other large trout and his 5 fish for 14lb 14.4ozs put him in 18th position.

In 6th place with 9 fish for 20lbs 7.2ozs was Ben Robertson of West Lothian FD. This was only the second time that Ben had entered the National and in his first attempt in 2014 he also made the final and on that occasion he was 29th. Allan Gamble of RAF Fish Hawks was 5th with 9 fish for 20lbs 10.8ozs. Allan was in an International team in 2012. In 4th place was Graeme Lynch of Beith St Inans AC with 10 fish for 21lbs 7.6ozs. This was first time that Graeme had entered the National. What a way to start.

In 3rd place with 11 fish for 23lbs 1.6ozs was John Buchanan. John has had 13 caps for Scotland and has twice won the Brown Bowl.

In 2nd with 12 fish for 25lbs 9.6ozs was Peter Auchterlonie. Peter has had 14 caps for Scotland and he has also won the Brown Bowl twice.

In 1st place with 12 fish for 26lbs 3.8ozs was Stuart Marklow of Loanhead & District AC. Stuart entered the National in 2014 for the first time and made it to the final that year and finished 58th.

A total of 360 fish were caught which with the 2lb allowance for returned fish gave a total weight of 804lbs 5.6ozs. The best boatman was Chris Harkess who boated for Stuart Marklow and Kevin Andrews who between them netted 19 trout.

The National was sponsored for the third year by Ridgeline UK who provided Ridgeline Igloo Tops to all six semi-final winners along with a Monsoon Smock Coat to the National Champion, a Ridgeline Torrent Jacket to the runner-up a Pintail Smock Jacket to the third and a Ridgeline Grizzly Jacket to the captor of the heaviest fish in the final.

2015 Loch Internationals

Spring Match, Rutland Water, England – 29th May 2015

Scottish Team sponsored by: Fishers, Lake of Menteith Fisheries, Albert Bartlett, Principal And Prosper, CEF, Jim Youngman Carpets, Glencorse Reservoir, Newey & Eyre, 7 Plus 7 Construction, Jewson, BVG Airflo and Flyfish Europe.

The four home countries made their way to Rutland Water for the IFFA Spring International well aware that the weather forecast was predicting winds gusting to 40+ mph at some point during the practice and match days. It was generally bright on the Wednesday and Thursday with steady winds blowing down the South Arm towards the main basin. The conditions gave the teams a good opportunity to assess the water and set out their plans for the match day and all teams were keeping their findings and the number of fish caught in practice close to their chests. The match was fished on a partial catch and release basis with the first four trout being retained and an allowance of 2lb being given for returned fish.

The competitors arrived at Rutland on the Friday to fairly calm conditions and hopes were high that the weather forecasts would be wrong. It started to rain before the four countries marched down to the boats and when the rain passed the wind gradually increased in strength and pretty quickly it was making fishing difficult.

At the off a couple of boats set up outside the harbour with one of them into a fish pretty quickly. Most of the boats turned left with some competitors setting up inn East Creek while others made for the Sailing Club, New Zealand Point, Berry Butts and Gibbets. a couple of boats turned right and headed for Fantasy Island.

By noon the wind was really beginning to pick up and fishing became pretty difficult at Fantasy. Quite a few boats opted to move from the south shore to try Yellowstone and Old Hall Bays where there was some shelter to be found and late on a couple of boats moved over to May Tree Bank.

As the boats returned to the pier the team managers sought out their anglers to get the number of fish they had caught and at the same time they tried to get an indication of how the other countries had done. It was too close to call and the teams had to wait for the weigh-in for the result.

England were first to go to the scales and produced 61 trout for 118lbs 11ozs. Their top rod was John Hardy with 8 fish for 16lbs 2.625ozs and their Lloyd Pallet weighed-in the heaviest fish of the day at 2lbs 15oz. Ireland went next and their team recorded 45 trout for 87lbs 6.375ozs to take third place. Their top rod was Mike Keady with 10 trout for 20lbs 4 ozs which individually put him in third place.

The Scotland team knew that they had more fish than England but the result was decided on weight and they had to wait until their last man had weighed-in to find out that their 66 trout weighed 125lbs 1.125ozs which gave them the Gold medal.

Wales were last to the scales and their 43 trout for 84lbs 10.375ozs put them in fourth place. Their top rod was Gerallt Hughes with 7 fish for 13lbs 12.25ozs

This was Gus Shepherd's first international as the Scotland Team Manager and throughout the practice sessions and the team meetings he had been impressed by the volume of information that had been gleaned by all the team members on how Rutland was fishing and by the effort that had been put in by all of them to identify patterns and areas.



Scotland had three of the top four rods with outstanding performances by Derek Purves, Alan Gilbert and Andy Dunn. Derek Purves was the top individual rod with 12 fish for 23lbs 2.375ozs which won him the Brown Bowl. Alan Gilbert was close behind in second with 11 fish for 21lbs 6.375ozs and Andy Dunn was fourth with 10 fish for 20lbs 0.25ozs. Gus Shepherd was over the moon with his team's performance and when congratulating them he pointed out that it was the work put in by all the team members that was the key to their success.

Autumn Match Lake of Menteith, Scotland – 18th September 2015

England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales travelled to the Lake of the Menteith for the 2015 Autumn International which was held on 18th September and having won the gold medal on the last two occasions that the International had been held there Scotland were hopeful of being successful once again. However it was not until their last two anglers reached the scales that they knew that their weight of trout was enough to clinch the gold medal over England who had caught one more fish than them.

All four countries had been on Menteith on the Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday with some also having boats out on the Sunday and Monday. During the official practice days the weather had been mainly bright with the wind varying from a light breeze down to none at all. For a change the weather held the same through to competition day on the Friday when it was sunny for most of the day with the occasional light cloud encouraging the trout to be higher in the water. There was a mix of flat calm and light ripple throughout the match.

As piper Stuart Marshall played the competitors off for the 10am start it was apparent that a few areas of Menteith were going to be busy with boats. Most of the boats turned left and headed straight for Lochend with a couple of them stopping along the Road Shore while another made for the Butts area. The rest of the boats made a bee line for Cages Bay with a couple continuing on to the Malling Shore.

It was a mixed day's fishing and while a few of the competitors found the methods required to be successful in the conditions fairly quickly there were others who struggled throughout the day. The top 10 individual competitors each managed to net nine or more trout with the top rod taking 14 followed by a 13, 12 and 11. Four managed to net 10 trout and a further two had 9. Other competitors struggled in the conditions with fourteen rods taking three or fewer fish.

The competitors returned to the beach at 6pm and once the managers had spoken to their teams to find out how they had done the competitors made their way to the scales. The teams knew that England had caught 92 fish which was one more than Scotland who had 91. Ireland had 84 trout and Wales had 63. The competition was fished on a partial catch and release basis with each competitor retaining the first three trout that they caught and thereafter being awarded 2lb for each trout that they returned. The weight of an individual trout was not capped.

The international competitions are decided on the weight of fish caught and over the last 10 years the country with the most fish has not always taken the gold medal. In 2009 at Chew, Wales took the Gold medal by just over 1lb despite having three fish fewer than England. In 2008 at Melvin, Wales had one fish less than Ireland but took the Gold medal by just under 1lb and in 2005 at Menteith, Scotland won the Gold medal by just under 5lbs despite having two trout less than England. It was a nail biting end to the day.

England were first to go to the scales and the 14 trout for 30lbs 0.2ozs caught by their Craig Smith proved to be the best individual bag of the match. With seven of their anglers having bags of three retained fish averaging over 2lbs 8ozs they were setting a hard target of 201lbs 0.6ozs for Scotland.

Ireland were next to the scales and with two of their first three competitors coming forward with fish over 3lbs and their Robert Crichton having 11 fish for 24lbs 5.2ozs, which earned him an individual

fourth place, the weight of their fish climbed steadily but they couldn't overhaul England. Their total weight of 182lbs 10ozs put them in third place.

Scotland's Captain, Campbell Morgan, lead his team to the weigh-in and with his heaviest fish hitting the scales at 3lbs 10oz Scottish hopes were raised that they might be able to do it. Campbell had 12 trout for 26lbs 0.8ozs which put him third in the individual lists. Andy Dunn was fourth to weigh-in and when the weight of his biggest fish was called as being the heaviest trout of the day at 5lbs 7.8ozs the atmosphere was electric. Allan Smith was 10th to the scales and his bag of 13 trout for 27lbs 8.2ozs proved to be the top bag for Scotland and earned him second individual position overall. Mick Tait was second last to weigh-in and when the weight of his three trout was called at 10lbs 7.2ozs the writing was on the wall. With only George Whyte to weigh-in Scotland needed 2lbs 4ozs to win and when he was called as having 4 trout for 8lbs 12.2ozs it put Scotland 6lb 8oz clear of England and the Gold medal was theirs.

Wales followed Scotland to the scales and their Tim Llewellyn proved to be their top rod with 10 trout for 23lbs 3.4ozs which included a fish of 5lb 1.2oz. Their total of 63 trout for 139lbs 8.2ozs put them in fourth.

This was Gus Shepherd's second international as the Scotland team manager and having taken the Gold medal at the Spring International at Rutland the Gold medal at Menteith is some beginning.

2014 River International

River Liffey, Ireland – 26th June 2015

The four home countries were at Newbridge, Ireland to contest the River International Fly Fishing match on the River Liffey on Friday 26th June. It was dry during the practice days with the only rain of any consequence falling during the night prior to competition day but it was light enough to have no effect on the river. There was some light rain in the morning which quickly cleared leaving a mainly sunny afternoon. The river was on the low side.

Ireland comfortably won this match with a total of 43 placings having won three of the four sessions. England just held onto second place with 49 placings with Wales in third with 50 placings. Scotland were fourth with 67 placings.

Ireland took the lead in the first session with their Peter Doherty, Kevin Dunne and Arden Pollock all winning their sections. Albert Mulhall had a second and Darius Simkus had a third to give them 8 placings. England had two first placings in session one courtesy of Simon Robinson and Howard Croston and with 11 placings were well in contention. At this point Wales were lying third with 13 placings and Scotland were in fourth with 18 placings.

In session two Ireland again picked up three firsts courtesy of Peter Doherty, Kevin Dunne and Darius Simkus and remained in the lead with a total of 17 placings. England's Simon Robinson picked up another first to keep them in touch with a total of 22 placings. Kieron Jenkins picked up a first for Wales to put them on 27 places with Scotland still fourth on 34 placings.

It continued to go well for Ireland in session three with Peter Doherty and Kevin Dunne again picking up firsts to ensure they stayed in the lead with 31 placings. England moved a touch closer with 35 placings while Wales picked things up in the afternoon to move just behind England with 36 placings when their Keiron Jenkins, Rob Bending and Sean Jones all picked up firsts. Scotland remained in fourth with 51 placings.

It was still all to play for in session four but Ireland sealed their win with another two firsts from Peter Doherty and Darius Simkus. Simon Robinson picked up another first and England held onto their 1 placing advantage over Wales. Keiron Jenkins took another first for Wales but they were unable to overhaul England. Scotland finished on 67 placings.

This was a tremendous individual performance by Ireland's Peter Doherty to win all four of his sessions. He had 4 fish in session one; 8 fish in session two; 6 fish in session three and 8 fish in session four. In total he caught 26 trout of which 7 were over 30cm. Three competitors, Keiron Jenkins, Simon Robinson and Kevin Dunne, each won 3 sessions out of 4 with Keiron and Simon each recording a second in their other session.

The largest fish measured 39.5cm and was caught by Rob Bending of Wales.
