Report for 2016

Annual Report

It has been another very successful year with teams winning gold medals, membership numbers increasing and competition entries also going up.

Our club membership has increased again and it would be great to think that the steady drop we had seen in our annual membership numbers has bottomed out and perhaps we will have a few years of growth. In 2016 our club membership stood at 189 which was six clubs up on the previous year which in turn was two up on 2014. Of our 2015 members there were nine clubs that did not renew their membership but they were replaced by 11 new clubs and we were re-joined by four clubs that returned to membership after leaving a few years ago.

AGM

The 2017 AGM will be held on Sunday 5th March at the King Robert Hotel.

At the 2016 AGM the three special resolutions were all passed. The first of resolutions was to change the route of appeals in conduct matters. Any such appeals will now be to SANACC and not to SANA. Special resolutions 2 and 3 were to do with how many members a club must have and how many years they had been in existence before they could enter the competitions. A club now needs to have twelve members (reduced from fifteen) and to have been in existence for one year (reduced from two) before they can enter representatives in the competitions.

Subscriptions

The 2017 annual subscription has not been increased and will remain at £35. The cost of the annual subscription has not been increased since 2006.

Finance

SANACC remains in a sound financial position with sufficient reserves to ensure its survival in the event of unexpected changes to income or costs.

Sponsorship and Fundraising

The SANACC Committees, team members and competitors are grateful to the sponsors and individuals who supported them throughout 2016. The support that was received from the sponsors and those that attended the fundraisers or bought raffle tickets meant that once again the cost of representing Scotland in the international teams was kept at an affordable level whilst also rewarding success in the competitions.

Sponsorship/Fundraising - Loch Teams

Fishers, the Lake of Menteith, Albert Bartlett and 7Plus7 Construction were the main sponsors of the international loch teams in 2016. Mike Wilson of Fishers joined us as a sponsor in 2012 and committed to sponsoring the international loch teams for five years. That term has now been completed and although the direct sponsorship has come to an end Mike is continuing to provide support for the teams.

The international teams over the last five years wish to thank Mike for the level of support that has been provided by Fishers.

This was the fifth year of sponsorship by 7Plus7 Construction and in 2017 they will increase their level of sponsorship and will be the main loch team sponsor. It was the Lake of Menteith's eighth year of sponsorship and they have confirmed that they will sponsor the teams again in 2017. Albert Bartlett sponsored the teams for the second year in a row. The teams were also sponsored in 2016 by C.E.F., Newey & Eyre, Principal & Prosper, Bell Donaldson Steele, Jewson, Jim Youngman Carpets, Gallery Fishings, TJL Fishing, Magnet Trade, Bruce Stevenson, The Place, Travis Perkins, MGM Timber, Show Tec, Flyfish Europe, Scottish Shellfish Marketing, Orwell Ladies Curling Club, Orwell Mens Curling Club and Margaret King Jewellery.

There were three fundraiser competitions and a race night held during the year and the organisers of these events did a great job in drumming up support for the teams. The fundraiser competitions were held in February at Markle, Parkview and New Haylie and the management at the three venues went out of their way to make sure that the competitors had a great day. Sponsorship and prizes were provided at the fundraisers by Fishers, Angus Angling, Wychwood, Airflo, Scierra, The Rose House, R & M Distribution Ltd, Knockhill Racing, Kinross Golf Courses, Lake of Menteith, Upper Carriston Fishery, Carron Valley Fishery, Markle Fishery, Flybox, FritznFlies, Ian Wilson, Seamous Kelly, Mrs Burns, Mrs Mackenzie, Maggie Scott, Geyer Plant Services Ltd, N D Barrett Electrical Contractor, Ray Anderson Joinery, Gus Shepherd and Allan Smith Electrical.

Funds were also raised through the sale of 'Loch Cards' and the teams filled two wooden fly boxes with 140 flies which were raffled at the National heats and semis. The box filled by the spring team was won by Tyler Hay and the box filled by the autumn team was won by Alan Brock. The boxes were donated by W. S. Sinclair, Stromness.

Sponsorship/Fundraising - River Team

The river team was sponsored by Fly-Fishing World, RGMC Properties Ltd and Points North (International) Ltd.

Sponsorship – Scottish National Championship

The Championship was sponsored for the fourth year by Ridgeline UK who provided Ridgeline Igloo tops for the winners of each of the semi-finals. At the final Nigel Winkle of Ridgeline presented the National Champion with a Ridgeline Monsoon Smock and presented a Ridgeline Torrent jacket to the second, a Ridgeline Pintail Explorer to the third and a Ridgeline Grizzly jacket to Greg McLaren who caught the heaviest fish.

In the heats each of the competitors received a packet of gel fritz provided by Frozen North Fly Fishing. The Lake of Menteith provided commemorative bottles of beers to the winners of the heats and semi-finals held at the Lake.

The hook/fly measures used throughout the competition were sponsored by 7Plus7 Construction.

Sponsorship - Scottish Club Championship

The Scottish Club Championship was sponsored by the Lake of Menteith and to mark their 50th anniversary the Lake provided an engraved whisky flask and commemorative bottles of beer to the winners at each stage of the competition.

Each competitor in the semis and the final received a packet of fritz provided by Fly Tying Scotland and the hook/fly measures used throughout the competition were sponsored by Keir Hardie Joinery. Glassware was provided by Glencairn Crystal.

Sponsorship - Champion of Champions

Snowbee, The Lake of Menteith, Fly Tying Scotland, Keir Hardie Joinery, Glencairn Crystal and the Lomond Group sponsored the Champion of Champions. Snowbee provided a Snowbee Prestige Rod to the winner; a Snowbee reel for the second and a Snowbee line for the third. Fly Tying Scotland

provided a multi pack of fritz to the top three and a pack of fritz to all competitors; the Loch Lomond Group provided a bottle of Loch Lomond Signature whisky to each of the top three; Glencairn Crystal provided crystal ware for the winners and Keir Hardie Joinery provided the fly measures that were used throughout the competition.

Competition - Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship

The number of competitors who took part in the competition increased over the previous few years with 386 anglers contesting the heats. (2015 - 361; 2014 - 382 and 2013 - 375). The heat scheduled for Lintrathen in April had to be rescheduled due to the weather but all the others were able to go ahead as planned.

The 2016 Scottish National Champion is Jimmy McBride of Heriot AC (photo on front page). Neil Anderson of Monikie AC was second and Paul Garner of Alba Orvis FF was third. One competitor was disqualified during the heats for fishing with an oversize fly.

Competition – Scottish National River Championship

The heats and the final of the River Championship were held on the Pitlochry AC stretch of the River Tummel and we are grateful to them for their support. The number of anglers that fished the heats was down slightly with 34 taking part. This compared to 39 in 2015; 36 in 2014 and 43 in 2013. The 2016 Scottish National River Champion is Alan Hill of SPRA Fly Fishing Section West.

Competition - Scottish Club Championship

The number of teams taking part in the championship increased slightly with 167 teams contesting the heats as opposed to 165 teams in 2015. The 2016 Scottish Club Champions are Tartan Tyers FF "B". Lintrathen FF "A" were second and Heriot AC were third.

At each stage of the Championship collections are taken for charity and the generosity of the competitors is overwhelming with many of them also donating their prize cheques. Competitors are encouraged to donate £1 each at the Saturday night heats and again at the semis and finals. Raffles are also held at the Club and Champion of Champions finals. In February Brian Mackenzie of Neilston FF and Jim Crawford of Change FF, on behalf of all of the Scottish Club Championship competitors, handed over a cheque for £8,512 to Yorkhill Childrens Charity. £2,725 was raised this year which will be handed over to charity.

Competition – Champion of Champions

Competitors in the Champion of Champions qualify from the Saturday night heats of the Scottish Club Championship with the top five individuals each Saturday night going through to the Champion of Champions final. Spaces not taken up by the top five qualifiers are allocated on a count back at each heat. The 2016 Champion of Champions is Allan Smith of Kinross AC. Brian Mackenzie of Neilston FF was second and Alan Steven of Tartan Tyers was third.

Spring International - Lough Lein

The Spring International was won by England with 18 fish. Wales were second with 13 fish and Scotland, also with 13 fish, were third. Scotland's Alan Steven of FAFA won the Brown Bowl as the top individual with 4 trout.

Autumn International - Llandegfedd

Scotland won the gold medal at the Autumn International with 35 fish for 59lbs 1.5ozs. Ireland had two fish more with 37 trout but were beaten by weight and came second. Top rod for Scotland and third overall was Stuart Marklow of Loanhead & District AC with 6 fish for 11lbs 3.75ozs. Scotland's Alan Gilbert of SPRA FFS West was fourth with 6 fish for 10lbs 14.25ozs.

River International - River Don

Scotland won the gold medal on the River Don with 44 places which was 7 places ahead of Wales on 51 who came second. Scotland's David Downie of D & B Flyfishing was just beaten for the top individual position by Keiron Jenkins of Wales. Both of them had four first places but Keiron had more points.

Competition Results

124th Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship (Sponsored by Ridgeline UK, Frozen North Fly Fishing and 7Plus7 Construction)

The 2016 National Championship came to a conclusion with the final at the Lake of Menteith on Saturday 10th September. 391 anglers entered the competition which started in April and continued through heats and semi-finals at Carron Valley Fishery, the Loch of Harray, Lintrathen Reservoir, Loch Leven and the Lake of Menteith which reduced that number to the 60 anglers who contested the final.

The Championship was sponsored for the fourth year by Ridgeline UK who provided the winner with a Ridgeline Monsoon Smock. The second received a Ridgeline Torrent Jacket, the third a Ridgeline Pintail Explorer and the captor of the heaviest fish a Ridgeline Grizzly Jacket. Ridgeline also provided their Igloo Tops for all of the semi-final winners. The fly measures used throughout the competition were sponsored by 7 Plus 7 Construction while the Lake of Menteith provided commemorative bottles of beer to all the boatmen in the final and to the winners of the heats and semis held there. This year Frozen North Fly Fishing provided a packet of their gel fritz for each of the competitors.

The SANACC Committee wish to thank all of the sponsors along with Stuart Marshall who piped the competitors off at the start of the final; Wendy and Wilson Mitchell who provided the buffet; Ian and Eleanor Campbell who recorded the weigh-in, the staff at all of the venues who were helpful and patient throughout the year and of the course the 30 boatmen who gave up their time to ensure that we had a successful final.

The day started off bright with a light westerly breeze and very little cloud and as the boats set off about 80% of them made for the Cages, Stable Point, Malling Shore and Plantation areas with the rest going to International Bay, Road Shore, Butts, Gap and Sams Point. The breeze picked up throughout the day and almost all of the competitors were struggling to connect with fish and by mid afternoon the average bag was about 2 or 3. Conditions improved around 3.30pm when some thicker cloud covered the sun and more fish were seen to be moving.

At the half way point there 16 boats in Cages Bay with more drifting from the Malling Shore to Stable Point and others drifting over the deeper water on the lodge side of squirrel island. As the boats returned to the shore at 5.30pm there many concerned faces as the competitors discussed their day and tried to work out how many fish would be needed to get in the top twenty that were guaranteed a place in the 2017 teams that would represent Scotland at Chew and Menteith.



The last two hours of the final had proved once again to be the turning point for many competitors who managed to capitalise on the willingness of the trout to feed and the total trout caught by the 60 finalists was 301 for 660lbs 12.5ozs. The competition was fished on partial catch and release basis with the first three fish being retained and an allowance of 2lbs awarded for each returned fish. The heaviest fish to be brought to the scales weighed 3lbs 10.1ozs and was caught by Gilmerton FFC angler Greg McLaren

This was never going to be an easy final and out of the 60 anglers there were 3 previous National Champions; 5 Brown Bowl winners and 38 internationalists.

with 10 fish for 22lbs 3.7ozs and in third place with 11 fish for 21lbs 15.1ozs was Paul Garner of Alba Orvis FF

2016 Loch International

Spring Match, Lough Lein, Ireland – 27th May 2016

The IFFA Home Countries Spring International was fished at Lough Lein, Ireland on Friday 27th May with England coming out on top with 18 trout. The week started off with a good breeze but as the practice days headed towards match day it gradually became brighter and the wind dropped away day by day. On match day competitors were chasing the ripple in a mixture of sun and cloud. Towards the end of match day the breeze and catch rates picked up. The match was fished to a four fish kill and would have been followed by catch and release had any competitor been able to catch more than four trout. The minimum size of takeable trout was set at 10 inches measured to the fork of the tail.

The teams had been finding 10 inch trout hard to find during the practice sessions and as they returned to the shore after the match it was the same story with a total of 52 trout being brought to the scales by the four countries. England were first to the scales and their 18 trout for 4.111kg was good enough to secure first place. This was an excellent team performance by England with nine rods in the top 20.

Ireland were next to the scales and recorded 8 trout for 1.780kg which put them in fourth place. Scotland followed and their 13 trout 2.788kg was just edged out of the second spot by Wales who also had 13 trout but with a heavier weight of 3.302kg.



The top individual rod and winner of the Brown Bowl was Alan Steven of Scotland with 4 trout for 0.907kg. Alan also collected the Phoenix Silver Salver as Scotland's top rod.

Top rod for England was John Horsey with 3 trout for 0.711kg. Ireland's top rod was Noel Shiels with 2 trout for 0.536kg and top rod for Wales was Peter Thurnall with 2 trout for 0.607kg.

The heaviest fish of the day went to the scales at 0.430kg and was caught by Marco Orsi of Wales

Autumn International Match, Llandegfedd, Wales - 23rd September 2016

Scotland came from behind to take the gold medal in the Autumn International at Llandegfedd on 23rd September 2016. Ireland had netted 37 fish and looked to be heading for first place but the 35 fish caught by the Scottish team had a heavier weight and they took the first spot by 1lb 2.5ozs more than Ireland who had to settle for the silver medal.

The practice days were generally bright with very light winds and the fishing at Llandegfedd was challenging throughout the week. On the Tuesday there was a mix of light cloud and sun and the teams had some success. There was more cloud on the Wednesday which helped all four countries to increase their catch rates and identify the areas and tactics that might work on match day. Thursday was far brighter than the first two days and the trout proved to be elusive and it was with some trepidation that the weather forecasts for the Friday were being closely monitored.

Match day started off on the bright side with a light wind which gradually increased as the day progressed. At the off the boats split with a good number heading towards the dam to drift from there out to the open water with others heading over to the far bank and the remainder going to the bottom end to drift across the mouth of the cages bay and from the deeper water onto the monkey pole shore. Cloud cover eventually arrived around 3pm.

The managers were watching the match closely and they could see that it was not going to take a great number of fish to win and that it was going to be close. As the boats returned to the jetty at 6pm the managers quizzed their teams to find out how each of their anglers and their respective boat partners had done.

Gus Shepherd, the Scottish Team Manager, counted in 35 trout and as he was aware that Wales had 26 trout and that England had 30 he was hopeful of success. However when he heard that Ireland had 37 trout the hopes of the Scottish team took a dip.

England were first to the scales with a total of 30 fish. The match was fished on a partial catch and release basis with competitors retaining their first three fish and an allowance of 2lbs being given for each returned fish. With 25 fish retained and 5 fish returned their weight was 47lbs 4ozs which was later to put them in third place. The top rod for England was Philip Thompson with 7 trout for 12lbs 5.5ozs.



Ireland were next to the scales and with 28 fish retained and 7 fish returned their total weight for their 37 trout was 57lbs 15ozs which earned them the silver medal. There were three excellent individual bags for Ireland with Andrew Duncan winning the Brown Bowl as the top individual with 7 trout for 12lbs 9.5ozs.

Ireland's Tommy O'Loughlin was close behind Andrew with his 6 trout for 10lbs 1.25oz and their Basil Shields also did well with 5 trout for 7lbs 13.5ozs. The average weight of Ireland's retained trout was 1lb 6.8ozs.



Scotland were third to the scales and when their third angler, Peter Auchterlonie, weighed in the heaviest trout of the day at 2lbs 1.5ozs the Scottish hopes of overhauling Ireland were raised. Peter was followed quickly by Alan Gilbert who had 6 trout for 10lbs 14.25ozs and their eighth man, Stuart McLean, weighed in with 5 trout for 7lbs 10.25ozs.

Next up was Stuart Marklow with 6 trout for 11lbs 3.75ozs which earned him the Silver Salver as Scotland's top rod.

This gave Scotland a running total of 44lbs 14.5ozs and with 5 anglers still to come to the scales it looked like Ireland's total of 57lbs 15ozs could be within sight. When the tenth man, Derek Purves, weighed in 5 trout for 9lbs 6oz to put Scotland on 54lbs 4.5ozs it was looking good for a Scottish victory. Ben Robertson was next up with 1 trout for 1lbs 5.5ozs to edge them closer at 55lbs 10ozs and when Grant Sutherland put his one trout for 1lbs 15.75ozs on the scales the Scottish total was 57lbs 9.75ozs. Last man in, Mick Thomson, sealed the gold medal with one trout for 1lb 7.75ozs to put Scotland on 59lbs 1.5ozs. Wales were fourth to the scales and their 26 fish for 38lbs 13ozs put them in fourth place. Top rod for Wales was Tery Llewelyn with 6 fish for 10lbs 13.5ozs.

The weather was kind to the competitors in the final of the 2016 Champion of Champions with a light to brisk easterly wind throughout the day. It was mainly overcast and stayed dry with the sun breaking through for a couple of hours in the afternoon. This was another hard final which included four recent champions in the line-up (Shane Kelly - 2014; John Buchanan - 2013; Ray Anderson - 2012 and Gregor Fleming - 2009) a recent National Champion (Ronnie Glass - 2011) along with three recent Brown Bowl winners (Alan Steven - 2016; Ray Anderson - 2013 and John Buchanan - 2012) and two Silver Salver winners (Allan Smith 2015 and Ronnie Glass - 2012).

We wish to thank our sponsors Snowbee who provided a Snowbee Prestige Rod to the winner; a Snowbee reel for the second and a Snowbee line for the third. Fly Tying Scotland provided a multi pack of fritz to the top three and a pack of fritz to all competitors; the Loch Lomond Group provided a bottle of Loch Lomond Signature whisky to each of the top three; Glencairn Crystal provided crystal ware for the winners and Keir Hardie Joinery provided the fly measures that were used throughout the competition.

Thirteen trout were needed by Allan Smith of Kinross AC to become the 2016 Champion of Champions and his fish weighed 26lbs 4.1ozs just short of 2lbs too good for Neilston FF angler Brian

Mackenzie who finished in second with 12 trout for 24lbs 4.4ozs. Alan Steven of Forth Area Federation of Anglers snatched the third spot with 10 trout fo 22lbs 1.6ozs just ahead of Johnston FF angler Michael Ward who had 10 trout for 22lbs 1.3ozs.

In all there were five competitors with 10 trout with another five competitors on 9 trout and seven competitors on 8 trout. All competitors caught fish with the lowest bag being 3 trout.


