

Report for 2012

Annual Report

It has been another good year for the SANACC Competitions with the International Teams picking up a gold medal. There were a few changes during the last year which had an effect on the Bye Laws, the National Championship and the Scottish Club Championship.

AGM

A special resolution was put to the members at the 2012 AGM to amend the Bye Laws with regard to the action to be taken when an individual or a club is subject to a fishery ban. The resolution was approved and the Committee now has the authority to examine the circumstances of a fishery ban and decide whether or not the individual or club should be banned from SANACC competitions. One individual was subsequently banned until 1st January 2013 due to being the subject of a fishery ban. There are no special resolutions being put forward at the 2013 AGM

Annual Subscriptions

The SANACC annual subscriptions will not be increased in 2013 and will remain at £35. The subscriptions have not been increased since 2006.

Finance

Our finances remain in a stable position with sufficient reserves to give us breathing space in the event of an unforeseen drop in income or increase in costs.

Sponsorship/Fundraising

Numerous organisations and individuals supported the SANACC teams and competitions in 2012 and we are grateful to them for their help. It is our aim to ensure that cost is not a barrier to anyone being in any of the SANACC teams that represent Scotland and the sponsorship of the teams and support for the fundraisers go a long way to meeting that aim.

Sponsorship/Fundraising – Loch Teams

The two main sponsors of the Loch Teams in 2012 were the Lake of Menteith and Fishers. The Lake of Menteith has been funding the teams since 2008 while Mike Wilson of Fishers announced that he would be funding the teams for five years. The teams were also fortunate to be sponsored by BVG Airflo, Flyfish Europe, Oban Electrical Services, Lochgilphead & District AC and 7 Plus 7 Construction.

The loch teams had three main fundraising ventures during the year. They organised three fishing competition fundraisers, raffled two boxes of flies and sold 'hidden loch' cards. The competition fundraisers were held at Markle, New Haylie and Parkview Fisheries and the management at each of these venues went out of their way to make sure we had successful days. Theses fundraisers were sponsored by Glenstriven Estate, Norman T Craig House Furnishers, A & M Locksmiths, Rock Café, Borders Gun Room St Boswells, William Lockie Knitwear, Osprey Flies and MGM Timber. Prizes for the competitions and the raffles held there were supplied by Orvis, Angus Angling, Country Life, Fishers, Dave Downie Fly-Fishing World, Spey Ghillie-Jock Royan, Flybox, The Fishing Shop Greenock, Rods N Reels, Daiwa, Fishers, Hawick Knitwear, Johnstons of Elgin, SKB Tackle, Lawrence Finney, Glasgow Angling Centre, Hawick AC, Carron Valley Fishery, Alloa Angling Shop, Outdoor Game and Tackle, Jasmine Indian Restaurant and Parkview Fishery.

The tickets for the first fly box were sold prior to the Spring International and it was won by Brian Adam of BP Angling Club. The second fly box was raffled at the heats and semis held between the two internationals and was won by Jock Woods of RAF Fish Hawks.

All of these events along with the sponsorships raised £10,605 for the two loch teams.

Fundraising – River Team

The river team held a raffle at the Glasgow Angling Centre Open Day and also raffled a box of flies at the river and national heats. Sponsorship of the team and prizes for the raffle were provided by Dave Downie Fly-Fishing World, Bloke Fly Rods, Glasgow Angling Centre and Aberdeen and District AA and a total of £880 was raised.

Scottish Club Championship

Prizes for the heats, semi finals and final of the Scottish Club Championship were provided by Famous Grouse and Angling Active.

National Championship

Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship

For the first time in a number of years we did not have a heat of the National at Loch Awe. A heat was scheduled to be held there but due to a lack of entries it was not viable to run it. A total of 384 competitors took part in the 2012 Championship which was 11 down on the year before. The number of competitors does tend to vary from year to year and hopefully there will be an increase in 2013. Two competitors were disqualified for using oversize flies. In a change from previous years the boatmen in the final were allocated boats by ballot as opposed to accompanying the angler who had arranged their attendance. Some competitors reported that this change had made it harder to secure the services of a boatman but on the upside the boatmen are now more like controllers.

The 2012 National Champion is Ian Hutcheon of OTFA Stromness (photo on front page) who won through in a tight finish from Scott Miller (Stanley & District AC) and Jock Kettles (SANACC)

National River Championship

All four heats and the final of the 2012 Championship were held on the Pitlochry AC water of the River Tummel and we are grateful to the Pitlochry AC members and committee for their assistance throughout the Championship. Forty one competitors took part in the heats which was 2 down on the year before. The 2012 Champion is Mike Cordiner of Aberdeen & District AA. Mike has been ultra consistent over the last few years having been Champion in 2010 and runner-up in 2011. Dick Logan (Coldstream & District AA) was second and Jake Harvey (St Boswells, Newtown & District AA) was third.

Scottish Club Championship

Catch and release with a two fish bag limit was introduced in 2012 which helped keep the cost of the entry fee from being increased. It also meant that competitors were not restricted to only having five fish count and were able to benefit when they had a really good night. A total of 187 teams took part

in the heats which was 4 down on 2011. Top team in the final was Menteith Ospreys with Strathleven FF 'A' in second and Newton Mearns FF in third.

Anglers at each of the heats were asked to donate to the Scott McIver Appeal on behalf of the Cardiology Department of Yorkhill Hospital and between these donations and winners cheques that were returned at the finals a total of £1,792 was raised during the competition.

Champion of Champions

Quite a few anglers who qualified for the final of the Champion of Champions were unable to take up their places and the vacant spots were offered to the competitors next on the list from the relevant heats. Champion of Champions in 2012 was Ray Anderson of Leslie & Glenrothes with Jim Hay in second and James Fairlie in third.

Spring International - Lough Sheelin

Scotland had to settle for bronze in the Spring International at Lough Sheelin. There was not a lot in it with Ireland taking the gold with 34 fish. Wales were second with 32 fish and Scotland had 27. Top individual rod and winner of the Brown Bowl was Kieron Thomas of Wales. Top rod for Scotland and winner of the Phoenix Silver Salver was Ronnie Glass (2011 National Champion)

Autumn International - Llyn Brenig

Scotland had a resounding victory in Wales and took the gold medal with 52 fish. England was second with 38 fish and Ireland was third with 32. The top individual rod and winner of the Brown Bowl along with the Phoenix Silver Salver was our John Buchanan with the second, third and fifth individual spots being filled by our Kevin McCabe, Wullie Leach and Peter Auchterlonie. To crown a remarkable day Kevin McCabe took the trophy for the heaviest fish.

River International - River Tay

We hosted the River International on the River Tay but had to settle for the bronze medal. Gold went to Wales with 31 fish. England was second with 18 fish and Scotland was third with 9. Top individual rod was Allen Hughes of Wales who had 12 fish. Top rod for Scotland was Richard McHattie (River Champion in 2011) with 3 fish.

The River International could not have taken place without the assistance of local angling associations, riparian owners and of course the twenty five individuals that helped out on the day. We are particularly grateful to Kinnaird Estate, Dalguise Fishings, Dalmarnock Fishings, Dunkeld House Fishings, Gordonian Fishings, Dunkeld & Birnam AA, Perth & District AA, The National Trust For Scotland, Forestry Commission and Scotland's Hotel.

Committee and Management Changes

At the 2012 AGM Ian Wilson (Clatto & Stratheden AC) was elected as the representative of Fife, Kinross, Clackmannan & Stirling to replace Michael Wilson who had completed his term. Ian is also on the Rivers Committee and has previously served as the International Secretary.



Stan Headley replaced John Ross as manager of the International Loch Teams and got off to a great start with a bronze at Lough Sheelin and the gold at Llyn Brenig. There were three candidates for the post of manager and after interviewing all three the selection committee opted for Stan.

Competition Results

120th Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship

The Championship had a setback in 2012 before it even got going when a lack of entries for the heat at Loch Awe resulted in that heat being cancelled. A total of 384 competitors took part in the heats which gave us 61 anglers in the final with a port angler making the numbers even.

On the day of the final the competition to be nominated the 2012 Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Champion was fierce. Also at stake was a place in the teams representing Scotland in the 2013 Spring and Autumn Internationals with the top eighteen being guaranteed a spot in one of the teams. The competition was fished on a partial catch and release basis with the first three trout being retained and 2lbs being awarded for each trout caught and returned thereafter. The weight of any large fish was capped at 4lbs.

The Lake of Menteith had set aside the boats on the Thursday and Friday to give the finalists the opportunity to practice and the competitors that were able to go out on those days were faced with strong winds. On competition day the wind was still blowing but although it wasn't as strong as it had been the previous two days it was strong enough to suggest that two days of practice would not be wasted.

At 9.30am the boats set off and right from the start it could be seen that the competitors expected to find fish in a variety of locations. While the majority of the boats set off in the direction of Gateside Bay a good number made for the Heronry, Lochend, Road Shore, International Bay and Hotel Bay. Many of the competitors struggled in the morning and although word was coming in that one or two anglers were putting together good bags it looked like the conditions were making the fishing hard.

By 5pm many of the boats were setting up their final drifts around Shear Point and Hotel Bay. The first of the boats came in at 5.20pm and the rest started coming in 5 minutes later. Many competitors were reporting that they had eight or nine fish and it was too close to call before the weigh-in.

The competitors weighed-in with their boat partners and nine of them had bags of between 8 and 10 trout. Two anglers had 10 fish with one of them claiming the top spot and the other finishing third. Top rod and the 2012 National Champion was Ian Hutcheon of OTFA Stromness with 10 trout for 21lb 2.4 oz.

In second place was Scott Miller of Stanley & District AC who had 9 trout for 20lb 13.8oz. and in third place was the SANACC Chairman Jock Kettles who had 10 trout for 20lb 2.2oz.

There were quite a few fish over 4lb brought to the scales but the heaviest fish of the day was a beauty of 5lb 6.6oz which was taken by Kenny Finlayson of Gartmore AC. The top boatman on the

day was John Brown who was out with Boat 27 which was occupied by James Litster of Neilston FF and Derek Purves of Bank of Scotland East AC who between them netted 16 trout.

The success of the competition is dependent on the many people who give up their time to assist with the management of the event and the organisations and their staff which provide us with support. At the start of the day the competitors were piped off by Stewart Marshall and at the end of the day Eleanor and Ian Campbell did the weigh-in for us and produced a printed set of results for each of the competitors. Thirty two men acted as boatmen and port angler and we are grateful to Eleanor, Ian, Stewart and the boatmen/port angler for their assistance.

The Glasgow Angling Centre provided the hook/fly measures that were used through all stages of the competition and provided a substantial discount on the prize vouchers that were awarded to the prize winners. Wendy Mitchell again put on a very welcoming buffet for the competitors and boatmen that was ready for them when they came off the water. Quint and Douglas at the Lake were once again very patient and helpful and the SANACC Committee wish to thank Paul Devlin of the Glasgow Angling Centre along with Quint, Douglas and Wendy for their assistance.

The top 18 from the Championship along with 5 carry forwards from each of the 2012 Internationals will go forward to form the pool of 28 for 2013 Home Internationals to be held in England and Scotland. Twelve competitors between 19th and 37th had five fish and if any one of them had caught one more trout they might have been in next year's teams. It was a very close result.

2012 Home International - Lochs

Spring Match - Lough Sheelin, Ireland – 18th May 2012 Scottish Team sponsored by Fishers, Lake of Menteith Fisheries, Oban Electrical Services, BVG Airflow, Flyfish Europe and Lochgilphead & District AC.

Ireland provided a superb venue for the 2012 Spring International which was held on Lough Sheelin on 18th May. Water clarity was excellent; the fish were plentiful and of a good size; fly life was prolific and of the course the boatmen made sure that everyone had a good time. During the week the mayfly made a very regular appearance and were attracting trout at various times on each day. Numerous trout over 4lb were caught and at least one at 6lbs was landed.

The competition was entirely catch and release with the minimum size set at 30cm. Twenty points were awarded for each fish plus one point for each centimetre of length. 106 fish were caught on match day. The day started off bright with a brisk breeze and as the day progressed the cloud cover and wind strength increased to give near perfect conditions although on the cold side. The mayfly put in an appearance and trout were moving to them in many areas.

The competition was a close run event and produced a nail biting finish. England were first to weighin and their 13 fish gave them 788 points. Ireland was next and recorded 34 fish for 2076 points. Scotland followed with 27 fish for 1692 points. Wales were last to report and with 32 fish the Welsh and Irish teams were on tenterhooks as they waited for the Welsh points to be announced. There had been many good sized trout taken and the result could have gone either way. The Welsh points were announced as 2004 points which gave them the Silver with Ireland taking the Gold.

Ireland had put in the hours on Sheelin during the months before the match and the Gold medal was well deserved. Wales had also put in the ground work with some of the team reported as being on Sheelin the previous week. It nearly paid off for them.

The Brown Bowl for the top individual rod went to Kieron Thomas of Wales who had 7 trout for 470 points. His trout averaged just under 47cm. Arden Pollock of Ireland was second with 6 trout for 355 points (average 38cm) and Russell Owen of Wales was third with 5 trout for 322 points (average 44cm).

Scotland's top rod and winner of the Phoenix Silver Salver was Ronnie Glass with 4 fish for 265 points.

The top rod for England was Mark Wytham with 4 trout for 242 points. Ireland's top rod was Arden Pollock and top for Wales was Kieron Thomas. Both Ireland and Wales had four competitors in the top 10 while England and Scotland had one.

With 27 trout, Scotland were not too far off the mark but by the time the team managers had done a quick count it was clear that we were destined for the bronze medal.

Autumn Match - Llyn Brenig, Wales - 7th September 2012 Scottish Team sponsored by Fishers, Lake of Menteith Fisheries, Oban Electrical Services, BVG Airflow, Flyfish Europe, Lochgilphead & District AC and 7Plus7 Construction

Following two silver medals in 2011 and a bronze medal in the 2012 Spring International, the Scottish team put themselves back on the gold medal track by winning the 2012 Autumn International. Llyn Brenig has been a good venue for Scotland in the past having won gold medals there in 2006 and 2002 and with a wealth of experience in the team hopes were high of success again this year. The team included two previous Brown Bowl winners and seven winners of the Phoenix Silver Salver.

The team travelled to Wales on the Monday and had practice sessions on Brenig on the Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday which it was hoped would help the anglers form their game plan for the competition day on the Friday. As so often happens the wind and weather conspired to ensure that

no two days were the same. On the Tuesday the wind was mainly from the north and there was a fair amount of cloud cover. On the Wednesday the wind turned round more to the south west and to finish off the practice sessions the wind picked up considerably on the Thursday to make fishing uncomfortable in the bright sun.

On competition day the wind dropped back and was mainly from the west and southwest. The light cloud cover quickly cleared and it was apparent from early on that the fishing would be challenging. Reports coming in during the day identified that the England team were doing well with many of their rods having caught three or four fish and it was thought that they were Things changed later in the in front. afternoon when some of the Scottish rods started to put together good baskets and when the managers did their count as their teams came off the water it looked likely that Scotland would win.

The result was confirmed when the teams went to the scales and Scotland took the Gold medal with 52 fish for 72lb 3oz.

England was second with 38 trout for 52lb 2oz; Ireland was third with 32 trout for 45lb 10oz and Wales were fourth with 18 trout for 23lb 9oz.

Scottish rods filled the first three individual places with the Brown Bowl for the top rod going to John Buchanan who had 9 trout for 12lb 7oz. Kevin McCabe was second with 7 trout for 11lb 3oz and Wullie Leach was third with 8 trout for 11lb. Nine of the Scottish team finished in the top twenty.

Top rod for England was Steve Cullen with 4 trout for 5lb 15oz. Niall O'Neill was the top rod for Ireland with 5 trout for 7lb 13oz and Jason Heath was the top rod for Wales with 3 trout for 3lb 15oz.

The trophy for the heaviest fish went to Kevin McCabe for his trout of 2lb 14oz.

The top five Scottish rods of John Buchanan, Kevin McCabe, Wullie Leach, Peter Auchterlonie and Kevin Porteous will be carried forward to the 2013 Internationals.

The 2012 River Fly Fishing International was held on the River Tay, Scotland on Friday 29th June and was won convincingly by Wales.

The Tay catchment area had missed the worst of the rain that caused flooding in many parts of the UK and during practice it was running about 18 inches above normal summer levels but overnight on Thursday it rained constantly. By Friday morning the Tay had risen another 18 inches and had taken on a fair bit of colour. The rain continued through Friday but the level did not rise further.

A total of 187 teams took part in the 2012 heats which was 4 down on 2011. This year catch and release with a two fish bag limit was introduced which helped keep down the cost of the entry fee. It

also meant that competitors were not restricted to only having five fish count and were able to benefit when they had a really good night.

The twenty teams that had qualified through the Saturday night heats and the two semi finals contested the final on Friday 28th September at the Lake of Menteith. Conditions were hard with a biting wind that blew up three or four times during the day when it drove the rain across the water. The competition was on a partial catch and release basis with anglers retaining their first two fish and being awarded 2lb for every fish returned thereafter.

Things slowed down after a squall about 1pm with his other fish coming steadily thereafter. Peter took his trout at Reedy Point and Gateside Bay. At Reedy Point he fished a tequila fab on a midge tip line while in Gateside Bay he used tequila blobs and boobies on a DI5. George stuck to Lochend and the Butts and took his trout on a tequila fab and a claret snatcher on a midge tip line.
