Annual Report

It was all go in 2010 with administrative changes, competition changes, a new website and success for the International teams. Your Committee wishes to thank all the club secretaries and competitors for the support and encouragement they gave throughout the year.

AGM

The Annual General Meeting was held early in March at the King Robert Hotel, Stirling and the representatives of 52 clubs turned out to discuss, along with other matters, proposed changes to the Articles of Association and the Bye Laws. The changes to the Articles were mainly to allow proxy voting to comply with company law and to amend the make-up of the Committee. All three special resolutions were passed and the change to the Bye Laws means that membership of SANA is no longer a requirement for taking part in our competitions.

A further change to the Articles is being proposed at the 2011 AGM which, if passed, will allow clubs which are unable to attend the AGM to vote by proxy on the election of specific committee members. At present the committee members, who are all elected annually, are nominated at the AGM and it is being proposed that nominations for election must be submitted by 15th October. This is the same timescale as proposals for amendments to the Articles and would mean that the names of those nominated for election would be circulated with the AGM paperwork.

Administrative Changes

The annual SANACC subscription is now set one year in advance which allows members to attend to their competition entries and subscription payment early in the year. In 2010 the annual subscription and the entries for the National Championship and the Rivers Championship were all sent to the same address and by doing this again in 2011 these entries and the subscription can be paid with one cheque. Almost all of the 2010 club subscriptions were paid well before the 1st May deadline and I wish to thank the club secretaries and treasurers for doing so. Chasing up late payers in previous years has been very time consuming but this year it only required two or three phone calls.

Website

Our website went live early in the year and gives members the opportunity to keep abreast of what is happening in the competitions. The web address is www.sanacc.org.uk and if you have access to a computer please pay it a visit. Competition entry forms can be downloaded from the

site and dates for the various heats of the competitions and the internationals can be found there as well. The competition results and usually photographs of the winners and qualifiers are posted to the site as soon as practicable and frequently we are able to get them on the site the same day. During the 2010 competition season 3,000 visits per month were recorded as being made to the site.

Subject to the information being provided by the competitors, a general breakdown of the flies and lines used along with the areas of the lochs that proved to be successful during each competition will be included in the competition reports that are posted to the site.

National Championship

All stages of the National Championship were fished on a partial catch and release basis with bag limits set at three fish at all venues.

There was a very tight finish to the final with only one fish separating the top three competitors. The 2010 winner was Peter Auchterlonie of St Fillans & Lochearn AA who caught 11 fish. Loch Leven fished well during the day throughout the summer and as a result the semi final there in 2011 will revert to a day session. A new venue is being introduced and in 2011 a preliminary heat of the Championship will be held on the Loch of Harray. In addition to discounting the prize vouchers for the final the Glasgow Angling Centre provided the fly measures used during all stages of the National and in 2011 they will also provide a bass bag for all competitors. We are grateful for their continued support

River International

The International Rivers Team had another setback this year when they travelled to England in July for the International match. The competition was held on the River Tees and was won convincingly by England with the Scottish team finishing in fourth place. Jim Fairgrieve, who has a wealth of experience at this level, came in at fairly short notice to manage the team and we are indebted to him for the amount of work that he put in. The team wish to thank the Borders Gun Room, St Boswells and Sharpe's of Aberdeen for the support they provided to the team.

David Downie will manage the team in 2011 which is going to Ireland and I am sure that his experience at International and World level will be put to good use. Applications are being sought for a regular team manager to take over from 2012 and if you are interested in this position please get in touch.

Loch Internationals

The Spring and Autumn teams travelled to Lough Conn in Ireland and Llynn Trawsfyndd in Wales and followed up the success of the 2009 Autumn team by winning the gold medal at both internationals. Both were won by narrow margins. The one thing that these three gold medal winning teams had in common was a tremendous team spirit and credit for this must go to our team manager John Ross and the three team captains Campbell Morgan (Autumn 2009), John Buchanan (Spring 2010) and Nigel Burns (Autumn 2010). It is over 30 years since Scotland last won three gold medals in a row with the last time being in seasons 1974 and 1975. The international matches now tend to be close run things and to win a gold medal is a great achievement. All Scottish competition anglers should be proud of the achievements of these three teams.

A strong north westerly wind made for difficult conditions and all four countries had to work hard to find trout that would make the 30cm mark. All trout caught were released and at the end of the day Scotland had netted 20 fish which earned them 1105 points. Ireland were second with 18 fish for 978 points, Wales were third with 17 fish for 916 points and England were fourth with 13 fish for 704 points.

At the Autumn International held at Lynn Trawsfynydd, Wales on Thursday 16th September, Scotland took the gold medal by a narrow margin from England.

There were strong westerly winds with torrential rain on the practice days and the Tuesdays practice was cancelled due to the strength of the wind.

At the weigh-in only three fish separated the top three teams. Scotland had 60 fish for 83lb with England in second place with 60 fish for 82lb 11oz. Wales were third with 57 fish for 80lb 7oz and Ireland were fourth with 38 fish for 52lb 4oz.

The Lake of Menteith sponsored the international teams in 2010 and I am delighted to say that they are doing so again in 2011. Sponsorship was also provided by Dunfermline Artisans AC and via the pairs competition run by Kenny Miller at the Lake of Menteith. To qualify for the international teams and thereafter represent your country can be expensive and all of the funds received from sponsorship and fundraising go directly to offset the cost of the items that are normally paid for by the team members.

During 2010 the teams embarked on numerous fundraising activities. Competitions were held at Markle, Raith Lake and Howood fisheries along with one at Achagour which was run jointly with the Ladies. Flies tied by the teams were put forward as prizes at raffles which were run during the National Heats and at the Glasgow Angling Centre where we had the opportunity to advertise our activities. A total of £5,609 was raised from sponsorship and fundraising.

Support was also received from BVG Airflow and Flyfish Europe and in 2011 they will be joined by Fishers and Pentland Ferries. We are grateful to those mentioned and the many others who supported the fundraisers and raffles and hope that our members will in turn support the businesses which have helped our teams.

River Championship

Following a few withdrawals, 54 competitors took part in the River Championship with 20 of their number going through from the four heats to the final. All four heats and the final were held on the River Tummell with 222 fish being caught during the heats and 76 in the final. The 2010 Champion with 11 fish is Mike Cordiner of Aberdeen & District AA.

Scottish Club Championship And Champion of Champions

192 teams entered the 2010 Championship of which 18 progressed to the final. A total of 1994 trout weighing 3471lbs were caught. The semi finals and final were fished on a partial catch and release basis with 350 fish being returned.

Sponsorship for the Scottish Club Championship was provided by the Daily Record, Angling Centre Stirling and Famous Grouse while the Champion of Champions was sponsored by the Daily Record, Famous Grouse and Snowbee and we are grateful to them for their support. The Daily Record has sponsored these competitions for over 30 years but unfortunately they have decided that they will now bring that sponsorship to an end. These competitions have benefited greatly from the sponsorship of the Daily Record and from the competition reports they published each Friday and we wish the Daily Record every success for the future.

Throughout all stages of these two competitions donations are collected from the competitors and at the end of the year the funds collected are donated to the Scott MacIvor Appeal on behalf of the cardiac unit of the Yorkhill Sick Childrens Hospital. Many of the prize winners also donate their prize cheques to the fund and this is added to by the proceeds of raffles held at the two dinners. This year the fund also received a donation from the charity competition run by Kevin McCabe and the total donation to the Appeal from the 2010 fundraising will be £4,100.

Competition Results

The 118th Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship Sponsored by the Glasgow Angling Centre

The 118th Scottish National Trout Fly Fishing Championship came to a conclusion on Saturday 28th August when 59 anglers contested the final at the Lake of Menteith. The Championship started for the entrants last year when they contested their club competitions to win the right to represent their clubs in the 2010 Championship. Out of the 15,000 club members, 390 of their number made it to the prelim stage which got under way in April. The competitors worked their way through a series of ten eliminatory heats and six semi finals which reduced their number to the 59 who took part in the final.

The final was a truly National event with the finalists coming from clubs ranging from the Borders through to Caithness, Orkney and Shetland. To reach the final is an achievement to be proud of.

Weather conditions on the day were good, if slightly chilly at times with a fairly strong wind gradually easing off. The leaders were all taking fish right up to the end of the session and in a close finish only one fish separated the top three rods. Peter Auchterlonie (2nd in 2002) from St Fillans & Lochearn AA came out on top with 11 fish for 23lbs 10.6ozs. Ian Storrar of Balbeggie AC was second with 10 fish for 21lbs 4.6ozs and Ronald Gilbert (winner in 2008) from St Fillans & Lochearn AA was third with 10 fish for 19lbs 4ozs.

The Committee wishes to thank Eleanor Campbell for recording the weigh-in and producing the printed sets of results. They also wish to thank all the boatmen and port anglers that assisted throughout the competition.

The Spring International was held over a 10am to 6pm session at Lough Conn on Friday 14th May. It was fished on a catch and release basis with the minimum size set at 30cm. 20 points plus 1 point per centimetre was awarded for each fish which made the mark with the measuring being done by the boatmen.

The fishing was hard on all the practice days with the wind being mainly from the North East or North West. It did swing round to the South for a short spell on the Thursday. The practice days were cold and only sporadic hatches of fly were seen in most areas. The mayfly hatches were more prolific in the Castlehill Bay area and there was a spell on Wednesday when there were good fish moving in the slicks when the wind eased. On competition day there was a strong wind from the North West and again it was cold and hatches were sporadic.

All four countries found it difficult and at the weigh-in there was only 7 trout separating them. Scotland took the gold medal with 20 fish with the host country Ireland taking silver with 18 fish. Wales were third with 17 fish and England were fourth with 13 fish. Top rod and winner of the Brown Bowl was Michael Roberts of Wales who netted five trout for 266 points. The Emyr Lewis Trophy for the largest trout went to Robert King of Ireland with a fish of 49cm.

Top rod for Scotland (2nd overall) and winner of the Phoenix Silver was Stephen Leask (Neilston FF) who had 4 fish for 227 points. Stephen lost the toss to his boat partner and was taken to Victoria Bay which was to be his first time fishing there that week. However he knew from the reports from the other Scottish team members that trout had been getting caught there and he was happy to fish there for the duration of the competition. He had two trout on his first drift and picked up the other two in the afternoon.

The Scottish Team travelled to Wales to contest the Home Countries Autumn International at Llynn Trawsfynydd. With three National Champions and two Brown Bowl winners in the team along with three new caps and an experienced squad they were hopeful of continuing the team's fine run of success which had seen Gold Medals at Lough Conn in the Spring and at the Lake of Menteith the previous Autumn

The competition was fished over the 10am to 6pm session on Thursday 16th September 2010 on a partial catch and release basis. All brown trout were returned with an allowance of 1lb given for each one caught. The competitors were to retain four rainbow trout and thereafter the rainbows would be returned with an allowance of 1.5lbs. Retained rainbows were capped at 4lbs.

On the Monday the teams went out for practice in a strong and gusting westerly wind which made fishing in some parts of Trawsfynydd difficult. Just for good measure there was torrential rain throughout most of the day and by the end of the day almost everyone was soaked to the skin. The wind picked up overnight and on the Tuesday fishing was cancelled. On Wednesday the wind had dropped slightly and although stronger than on the Monday the competitors were able to go out for their final practice day. As expected the water level had risen between 9 and 12 inches and much of the water was coloured. During the practice days the main concentrations of fish were found in Walkers Bay through to Islyn Bay; from Cae Adda through Tyn Twll and at the Totem Pole. The Scottish Team were hopeful that the information they had gleaned from two days on the water would be enough but with the wind forecast to switch to the north on competition day they were concerned that local knowledge would be of greater importance given the limited practice that had been put in.

As the boats returned to the jetty the team managers did a quick debrief with their competitors and all countries knew it was a very close finish with Scotland and England each having 60 fish, Wales having 57 fish and Ireland 38. At the weigh-in England were first up and their 60 fish went to scales at 82lb 11oz. Ireland followed with their 38 fish going in at 52lb 4oz. They were followed by Scotland and Wales and it was clear that it was very close.

England had returned 17 rainbows and 2 browns while Scotland had returned 7 rainbows and 2 browns and Wales 12 rainbows and 1 brown. As the weigh-in progressed it appeared that most of the rainbows that went to the scales were around 1lb 6oz and with 1lb 8oz being allowed for each one returned it looked like these extra few ounces could swing it for England. Wales were last to weigh-in and as they came to the scales it looked possible that the weight of their 57 fish could overhaul the weights of England and Scotland.

Finally the result was announced that Scotland with a weight of 83lb had won the Gold medal by 5 ounces from England. Wales were third at 80lb 7oz and Ireland were fourth at 52lb 4oz.

Brown Bowl winner for the best overall catch was Paul Shaw of England with10 fish for 14lbs 10ozs. The Emyr Lewis Trophy for the heaviest trout went to Peter Auchterlonie of Scotland with a trout of 2lbs 12ozs. The Phoenix Salver for the best Scotlish basket was won by Alan Porteous with 6 fish for 8lbs 13ozs.

The final of the Scottish National River Championship was held on the Pitlochry AC stretch of the River Tummel on Sunday 1st August 2010. Water conditions were good with levels and clarity being as expected at that time of year. It was generally overcast but with heavy rain around 11.30am and 4.15pm.

The winner, Mike Cordiner (Aberdeen & District AA) was drawn on the lower section in the morning and the upper section in the afternoon while Simon Cocker (D & B FF) who finished second was drawn the opposite way round. Fish were caught on a variety methods and while Mike took all of his fish on wets, Simon was successful with two nymphs fished under a dry. Session 4 (3.30pm to 5pm) proved to be the hardest time of the day with only seven of the 20 competitors taking fish. The leader board changed considerably after that final session with the three competitors who were lying 3rd, 4th and 5th after session 3 all failing to take fish. 76 fish were caught and released during the competition.

Session 1

After session 1, Richard McHattie (Aberdeen & District AA) led the field having taken 4 fish. Mike Cordiner, with 3 fish, was lying second and Simon Cocker (2 fish) was third. Robert Irvine and Hugh Skeoch (both Crown FF) were in 4th and 5th with 2 fish apiece.

Session 2

By the end of session 2 Mike Cordiner (2 fish) had moved into the lead from Simon Cocker and Robert Irvine who were tied for second having taken 1 fish each. David Downie (D & B FF) and Dick Logan (Coldstream & District AC) both had 2 fish and were tied for 4th place.

Session 3

In session 3 Mike Cordiner took 4 fish to consolidate his place at the top of the table and Simon Cocker (2 fish) was left in a clear second. Dick Logan, Ian Jones (Dunkeld & Birnam AA) and John Greep (Lothian & Borders Polce AC) each took 1 fish and moved up to 3rd, 4th and 5th.

Session 4

Mike (2 fish) and Simon (3 fish) kept their places in the lead and Calum Crosbie (Newton Stewart and District AA) with 2 fish came through to take third. John MacLennan (Earlston AA - 2009 winner) had a good 4th session with 2 fish which brought him up to 4th and Jim Fairgrieve (Edinburgh Breadalbane AC) with 1 fish moved up to 5th. David Downie who also had 1 fish took the 6th spot.

The International team for 2011 will be Mike Cordiner, Simon Cocker, Calum Crosbie, John MacLennan and Jim Fairgrieve with David Downie being the reserve and manager.

At the presentation of prizes at the Ballinluig Inn SANACC Chairman, Ian Campbell, acknowledged the importance of the controllers and thanked them for their help during the heats and the final. He added that SANACC wished to thank the members of Pitlochry AC and their Secretary, Ron Harriman, for allowing the use of their water and for the assistance provided during the competition.

In second place was St Fillans & Lochearn with 25 fish for 51lbs 4ozs. The St Fillans & Lochearn team were Ronnie Gilbert who had 13 fish for 27lbs 4.6ozs; Peter Auchterlonie who had 6 for 12lbs 3.6ozs and George Whyte who had 6 for 11lbs 11.8ozs.

In third place was Change FF AC 'B' with 23 fish for 49lbs 6.4ozs. Their team was Willie Leach who had 10 for 22lbs; Jim McBride who had 8 for 16lbs 11ozs and Jim Crawford who had 5 for 10lbs 11.4ozs. The fourth placed team was Newton Mearns FF who had 23 fish for 48lbs 11.6ozs.
